## Nature of support and curriculum focus for PPG spending 2011/12

Across EYFS & KS1 34% of pupils were eligible for FSM. The school put in place the following measures to reduce barriers to learning and narrow the attainment gap for these pupils:

- employed a teacher to reduce class sizes in KS1 by creating a split year 1 / 2 class;
- employed additional staff to facilitate target teaching across the Key Stages;
- deployed staff to carry out interventions supporting improved learning behaviours for 17 FSM pupils;
- one-to-one and small group support for 41 FSM pupils who also qualify as EMA pupils.

Across KS2 48% of pupils were eligible for FSM. The school put in place the following measures to reduce barriers to learning and narrow the attainment gap for these pupils:

- deployed staff to carry out interventions supporting improved learning behaviours for our LAC

pupils;

- a teaching assistant to run a homework club for 2 hours per week;
- a teacher 2 days per week supporting 60 FSM pupils in reading, writing and maths;
- deployed a non-class based teacher to support the higher ability children in maths; 5 of the children were eligible for FSM.

Across both key stages the following were put in place:

- ensuring the participation of FSM pupils in educational visits by subsidising any shortfall with the pupil premium allocation.

## **Measuring the impact of PPG spending**

The impact of the Pupil Premium Funding is as follows:

- the interventions put in place in EYFS & KS1 supported our FSM children to attain broadly inline with national averages in reading and maths;
- in KS2 our FSM children out-performed their national average counterparts;
- the progress made by FSM children from KS1 to their KS2 SATS results was better than the national average and in English significantly so;
- FSM pupils across all year groups were able to progress broadly in line with national expectations.
