



## **Sports Premium**

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013-14 and 2014-15 to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding, provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, will be allocated to primary school headteachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of P.E. and sport in schools.

### **How we are using our sports premium**

At Olive Hill we will use the grant in the following ways to the benefit of all pupils.

- Purchase of additional gym equipment so that the small hall can be used effectively to teach gymnastics
- One and half days of training in gymnastics teaching for all teaching staff (Youth Sports Trust)
- Purchase of equipment to increase participation in competitive sports
- Providing opportunities for pupils to compete in local tournaments
- Coaches to promote physical activity at lunchtimes and after school

### **How we will measure the impact**

- Higher quality PE teaching across EYFS, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2.
- Increased use of the small hall for teaching gymnastics
- Increased participation in competitive sports e.g. cross country, netball
- More children to be involved in physical activity during lunchtimes.
