Progressive tense

The Past Progressive

The past progressive tense describes an action that was in progress in the past. It is formed by using the pas tense of the verb 'to be' and the -ing version of the verb in question.

e.g. We were playing football. They were running across the road.

The Present Progressive


The present progressive tense is used to describe an action that is currently in progress. e.g. I am cleaning my shoes. He is choosing a sofa. They are building a model.
