Our learning experience:

The theme for our summer term learning experience is 'The Black Country's Bostin!' This will be our science and design technology based topic which will culminate in the children creating a project in school to showcase their learning. We will be discussing the answer to our Big Question: 'What makes the Black Country unique?'. The children will be learning about the history of our local area as well as the characteristics and location of places of special interest to the Black Country. Any research you would like to do at home is encouraged!



English: During this term we will be writing a setting description and narrative letter based upon The Worst Witch by Jill Murphy. Alongside this, we will use this text as inspiration for non-fiction work such as spell recipes, poetry and a diary.

Maths: This term in Maths we will be focusing on fractions, time, position and direction, and measurements. We will also be revisiting multiplication and division to aid with further problem solving and multi-step problems.

Science: Our topic this term in science is plants. Children will be predicting what different seeds grow into, and taking part in an experiment to see what a plant needs to grow and stay healthy. We will also be using drama to understand the life cycle of a plant and plant reproduction. It will be a very hands-on and practical topic which we hope will help the children gain a deeper understanding.

Art and DT: In art we will be looking at imitating the work of L.S. Lowry's 'matchstick men' in relation to our topic. In DT we will be designing, making and evaluating our own protest flags in reference to the chainmaker strikes.

PE: This term the children will be developing understanding of the principles of net and wall games to maximise chances of scoring when playing games. We will also be preparing for sports day by developing our athletic skills and learning the importance of striking and fielding.

RE/PSHE: During these lessons, the children will be looking at the values of honesty, courtesy and fairness. We will also be preparing to move into year three by discussing the changes that happen in our lives and how we deal with them. Our key question in RE is 'Why are religious teachings important?' We will be looking at Christianity, Islam and Judaism to answer this question.

Computing: In computing the children will learn to recognise that different devices can be used to capture photographs and gain experience of capturing, editing and improving photos of the school.
