# Our learning experience:

Our learning experience is 'There's magic in this tiny seed...'. We will learn about how plants and flowers grow and change. Throughout this learning experience, the children will also be learning about minibeast including butterflies, ladybirds and spiders. The children will have the opportunity to learn about the life cycle of a butterfly through a first hand experience. We are excited to share this journey with our children.





# English:

This term, the children will practise oral blending and segmenting, including reading some CVC words. We will also be reading a variety of high-quality texts including: The Very Hungry Caterpillar and The Very Busy Spider by Eric Carle. During the term, we will also learn to orally retell 'The Enormous Turnip' to develop the children's comprehension skills.

## Maths:

In Maths, the children will start to learn to write numbers to 10 and beyond. We will learn mathematical language to describe the weight and capacity of a range of objects. The children will also learn about positional language and exploring language related to size. The children will continue to discuss the date and count daily.

# Understanding the World:

We will learning about how plants and animals grow and change. The children will have the opportunity to plant a range of seeds or bulbs to observe their growth over time. The children will also learn about different minibeasts. We will learn about how butterflies grow and change through stories, books and our butterfly growing kit.

# Expressive Arts and Design:

During this term, the children will also have the opportunity to explore their own creativity. The children will practise different techniques to make marks, draw and paint and will have the opportunity to use different media and materials, such as, crayons, chalk and charcoal. We will create sunflower paintings inspired by the work of Van Gogh.

### Prime Areas:

The children will continue to develop the prime areas of personal, social and emotional development, communication and language and physical development through their play and taught sessions. We will continue support the children to behave respectfully and follow our rules, showing that they can be 'Ready, Respectful and Safe' in school.
