Our learning experience:

We want to learn as much as we can about your wonderful children so our first learning experience focuses on discovering all about them. Our learning experience is called 'There's only one you in this great big world'. Throughout this learning experience, the children will be learning about their families, different cultures and traditions. The children will also discuss their bodies and how we keep ourselves healthy.



English:

This term, the children will be developing their listening skills. We will be reading a variety of stories. Some of the stories we are reading are: Colour Monster written by Anna Llenas and There's Only One You by Kathryn Heling. The children will start to learn some simple nursery rhymes and songs. It is important to us that children develop a love of reading and we will be encouraging that through the use of diverse, high-quality texts and daily storytelling.

Maths:

In Maths, we will start to learn about numbers to 5. We will practise counting objects and pictures to five. The children will also be naming and recognising 2D shapes and developing their mathematical vocabulary.

Understanding the World:

We will be exploring different customs and cultures through the use of our role play area. They will also start to develop more understanding of their bodies and start to discuss how to stay healthy. Your children will also start to discuss the people who are in their families and some of their history.

Expressive Arts and Design:

The children will practise different techniques to make marks, draw and paint and will have the opportunity to use different media and materials, such as, paint, crayons, pencils and chalk.

Prime Areas:

The children will develop the prime areas of personal, social and emotional development, communication and language and physical development through their play and taught sessions. The children will begin to learn our school rules 'Ready, Respectful and Safe' and we will model how to behave safely and sensibly in the classroom. We will ensure the children feel safe and comfortable and help them to settle into their new routine at nursery.
