<p style="text-align: center;">Word Parts</p> <p>Write your words. Then use a coloured pencil to divide the words into syllables. e.g. jumping caterpillar</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">ABC Order</p> <p>Write all of your spelling words in alphabetical (ABC) order.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Vowel Spotlight</p> <p>Write your words using one colour for the vowels and another colour for the consonants. (vowels: a, e, i, o, u)</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Bubble Letters</p> <p>Write your spelling words out in bubble writing.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Rainbow Words</p> <p>Write your spelling words with coloured pencils. Make each letter a different colour.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">"Ransom" Words</p> <p>"Write" your words by cutting letters out of a newspaper or magazine and gluing the letters on a piece of paper to spell your words.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Scrambled Words</p> <p>Write your words. Then write them again with the letters mixed up. Can you unscramble them again the next day? e.g. watch - cwhta</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Silly Sentences</p> <p>Write 3 or more sentences that use all your spelling words.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Word Search</p> <p>Create your own word search with your spellings. Show the answers to your puzzle in a different colour.</p>
